During the summer I read many books. On the first day of school I would like you to bring in a book that you would recommend highly to another fourth grader.


Our year in fourth grade will be full of excitement as you meet with new success! As I often quote, "The future is hidden even from those who make it." Here's to us making an amazing future together.
